searching for your photographer

Finding the right photographer for you and your family can be a daunting task. Because of the increasing availability of digital equipment, professional photography has become an extremely competitive market. There are lots of websites to sort through, blogs to pour over, and advertisements everywhere. It can seem almost impossible to find a perfect fit! The good news is that with a little time and effort, you can do your own research and find a photographer that's just right for you.

START CLOSE TO HOME

A great way to start your photographer-seeking journey is by asking friends and family if they recommend anyone in the area. Chances are good that they've worked with (or know someone who's worked with) a great photographer for portraits or life events. Chances are also good that a photographer who's worked well with people close to you will also work well with you!

ONLINE RESOURCES

Using Facebook and internet searches are also great ways to find local photographers. Most professional photographers have a strong online web presence with portfolios of their work for you to browse. Once you've found a few studios you're interested in working with, don't be shy about setting up interviews! Schedule a phone call or casual in-person meeting to get a feel for the photographer and his/her process for creating images. It will quickly become clear whether it's a good fit for both of you!

Hint: It's always a good idea to ask a photographer to see a complete gallery of images from photoshoots. A good photographer will have a consistent style they carry throughout an entire set of photographs. You want to be sure that you will get an entire gallery full of images you love, not just one or two.

PRICING

It's no secret that great art is expensive, and this can be the case for photographers as well. Remember that these images are an investment in yourself and in your family. Good photographers intend your images to be family heirlooms and plan for this by offering archival-grade print products built to hold their color and detail for a lifetime

Although choosing the least expensive photographer may seem like an attractive option, there is most likely a reason they're so cheap! Great photographers with good client service are typically booked solid and price themselves to reflect this. If budget is a main concern in selecting a photographer, try contacting a few "dream" photographers and let them know your intended price range. They may be willing to work with you and offer payment options or smaller packages to fit within your budget.

PERSONALITY

Have you ever met a new friend, significant other, or business contact that you just "click" with? Your personalities seem to fit as though you've known each other far longer than you really have, and you feel comfortable in conversation. Finding the right photographer should feel this way as well - at least to a certain extent! You are hiring a photographer to document you or your family: to understand what makes you special and bring out the best in you on camera. It's essential to find someone you feel comfortable with, someone who can really see what makes you who you are and translate that into visual art. This special chemistry will make all the difference in the final images!

Hint: Photography is an art; as such you can expect every photographer to offer a unique style of imagery. You don't have to be an art expert to decide whether or not you like a style - just browse through their portfolio. If the photographs you see make you feel good and are something you could envision in your home, chances are the photographer is a stylistically good fit for you!

LEARNING ABOUT THE DIFFERENT Photography styles

A photographer will generally tell on their website what kind of photography they specialize in. Here's a cheat sheet for what it all means!

LIFESTYLE

"Lifestyle" photographs are natural and unposed, documenting small, intimate moments throughout your time in front of the camera. Lifestyle images should look free and easy, focusing mostly on the personality and interaction of the portrait subjects in a relaxed setting.

POSED

Posed images are a more traditional approach to portrait photography. The photographer will direct you throughout your photo shoot in a variety of poses that bring out your best features while hiding the rest. Great posed images should not look stiff or stoic, but have a definitive "I'm being photographed" style to the subjects that you wouldn't normally see in real life. Creamy skin tones and flattering poses are very important to look for!

NATURAL LIGHT

"Natural Light" photographers use only light from the sun in their work. Great natural light portraits are radiant and have a special warm glow about them that illuminates their subjects. Natural Light photographers generally only work during certain times of the day when the light is at its best (around sunrise and sunset), so be prepared to schedule your day around the photoshoot!

IN-STUDIO

Studio lit portraits are taken in a controlled environment with professional lighting set-ups. The best studio photographers masterfully use their lights to create creamy, soft skin tones and accent your very best features. Studio portraits are carefully composed and have a deliberate look to them. Most photos you see of beautiful models in magazines are taken in studios, where the photographer has control over every element in the image.

When you choose to purchase only digital files from a photographer, there's a big risk that your final products won't be to the quality or standard you were hoping for. When you purchase a print product from an experienced photographer, they may spend hours perfecting the crop and colors of the photograph to produce the best possible result when printed. This process of color correction is often overlooked, but absolutely essential to reproducing what you see on your computer screen accurately onto printed media. Most consumer-facing print labs also do not offer the standards of color quality that professional labs do, and you may find yourself with prints that are muddy and awkwardly trimmed. You also risk losing all digital images that are only maintained through digital archiving.

why buy an archival grade handmade album

Photographs are meant to be printed. There is nothing quite like an exquisitely designed, handcrafted photo album to display and preserve your images in a way that everyone can hold and enjoy. Although online galleries and digital image displays are becoming an increasingly popular, inexpensive way to display photographs, there is still nothing like a physical photo album.
